# Post-Operative instructions for evacuation of Thrombosed Hemorrhoid in office

# Call and schedule your post-op visit to occur approximately 7-10 days after surgery.

### Wound care:

- 1) Seitz baths are encouraged several times a day.
- 2) Moistened wipes should be used for gentle cleaning of your rectal area after a bowel movement.
- 3) You may take a bath 24 hours after surgery.
- 4) Do not sit on a donut device as this may increase swelling to the area.
- 5) Pain medication should be used as directed.
- 6) Dressings should be changed as they become wet or soiled. Gauze or sanitary napkins placed in the underwear work well.
- 7) You should start taking a stool softener daily on your first post-operative day and drink plenty of fluids. This will aid you in having a comfortable first bowel movement after surgery.

#### Diet:

1) You may advance your diet as tolerated after surgery.

#### Activity:

- 1) Normal daily activities are encouraged.
- 2) No driving until you are pain free and no longer using your pain medication.

#### **Constipation & Prevention of hemorrhoids:**

You should have a bowel movement within 3 days of surgery. If you are constipated, increase your water intake and use an over-the-counter stool softener such as mineral oil, Colace, Dulcolax or a laxative such as Milk of Magnesia as directed on the bottle. Pain medication often causes constipation.

Avoid constipation and straining by adopting the following measures:

- Drink at least 8-ounce glasses of water or non-caffeinated drinks a day.
- Eat a high fiber diet with the goal of 25 to 35 grams of fiber per day. One of the best sources is a high fiber cereal.
- Take a fiber supplement once a day followed by a full 8 ounce (8oz) glass of water. After one week, you may increase the frequency to a maximum of three times a day as needed for constipation. Suggestions: Clear and Natural (5g/tsp).
- Take a stool softener such as Colace each day (no prescription needed).
- Do not sit on the commode for a long length of time. This tends to promote straining. Avoid reading while you are on the commode.

#### **Smoking:**

Smoking can cause a multitude of problems for a surgical patient, including the non-healing of a surgical incision and an increased rate of post-operative infection. Please do not smoke for two weeks prior to and two weeks after surgery.

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# Call our office if:

- 1) You have a temperature of 100.5 degrees or higher.
- 2) Your pain is not controlled with your pain medication.
- 3) Minimal bleeding is expected. However, you should report excessive bleeding

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
